
RULE THE RINK


Capacity building is the key to empowering our staff!

The session was led by Vaishali Gehani and Jyoti Nair, Grade 1 Teachers and Activity In-Charges, focusing on practical methods for improving classroom learning experiences. This initiative has empowered our teaching staff with renewed techniques and ideas to implement in their classes, fostering a collaborative environment for continuous professional growth. To strengthen awareness on safe digital practices, the school organized a Workshop on Designing a Safe Social Media Profile for Grades IX–XII under the CBSE Counselling Hub & Spoke School Model, inspired by the vision of NEP 2020 to reinforce mental health support systems.

Led by Ms Anita Sharma, the session highlighted responsible use of social media, protecting digital identity, and managing online risks. Students learned about privacy settings, phishing awareness, safe sharing, building a positive digital footprint, and reporting abuse or cyberbullying. Real-life examples and interactive demonstrations ensured practical understanding.



The workshop was well received, with students becoming more mindful of their online behavior and the long-term impact of their digital choices. Teachers noted high engagement and active questioning. Despite varied levels of prior digital exposure, the program significantly enhanced student awareness, confidence, and strategies for safer online interactions.

- Anvi Sharma (Class 9B) – Senior Folk


